Dodd-Frank Act (US H.R. 4173, § 1502) Conflict Minerals

ComS.I.T. is a global distributor of electronic components. Supply chain traceability is a key concern, and this also applies to the traceability of conflict minerals.

Title XV (Sec. 1502) requires companies to comply with documentation and disclosure requirements designed to ensure that materials such as tantalum (coltan), tungsten, tin or gold are not used to finance the armed conflict in the Democratic Republic of Congo or any adjoining countries. ComS.I.T. is aware of the conflict minerals reporting requirements. We do not support or contribute any violence and human right violations in the world.

ComS.I.T. is not an electronic component manufacturer and therefore is not able to provide accurate data on the use of conflict minerals in the products it sells. The only accurate source of information about conflict minerals used in the products it distributes is the manufacturer of the products.

As an independent distributor, ComS.I.T. is far removed from the mining of conflict minerals. We do not purchase raw or unrefined minerals, and we do not knowingly source parts that contain conflict minerals.

ComS.I.T. is committed to not purchasing products containing conflict minerals that directly or indirectly finance or benefit armed groups in the Democratic Republic of Congo or adjoining countries. We are fully aware of the importance of these issues. Especially for our own social responsibility and sustainability efforts, but also for customers and their supply chain.
