Statement on REACH Regulation EC No. 1907/2006

The European Union's REACH Regulation on the Registration, Evaluation and Authorization of Chemicals came into force on June 1, 2007. It regulates the manufacture, processing and import of chemical substances and of operating and auxiliary materials means of production, provided they fall within the quantities specified in the regulation. If this is the case, registration of these substances and quantities is required.

In accordance with the provisions of the REACH Regulation, the electronic components we distribute must be designated as "articles" within the meaning of REACH.

Companies that manufacture or import substances into the European Union that exceed one ton per substance are required to register. ComS.I.T. is not subject to registration as the import volume does not exceed the amount of SVHC's.

ComS.I.T. has reviewed this regulation to the best of its knowledge and has concluded that none of the products distributed by the ComS.I.T. Group intentionally contain any of the Substances of Very High Concern (SVHC's) currently on the Candidate List at a concentration greater than 0.1% by weight.
